The word is probably not earlier than the eleventh century. 14: 2 amor extaticus: The highest or Divine love is ecstatic, according to Bionysius, the source of; mediaeval mystical theology. Eon Si Kai CKoraTiKbc 6 GcZof cpoc, De Div. Nom. IV, 13. It takes a man out of himself (tK-araaic) and devotes him to the object of his love. So De Burys amor extaticus made his passion for book-gathering unselfish, for his intentio was to gather books for others.
